## Galena Receives Trail Grant

The Village of Galena has been awarded a \$148,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources to build a covered bridge over the Big Walnut Creek. The grant is pending approval by the Public Works Commission. The Village owns the land and the bridge frame that previously served as a narrow gauge train track for the Galena Brick Company. The grant was written by Mary Kerr with the Delaware County Friends of the Trail.

The future Kane's Crossing Trail is an integral part in completing connections for the Ohio to Erie Trail. The Genoa Trail to the south will eventually tie into Galena's Hoover Scenic Walkway. Then the trail runs through Miller Park to the Galena Brick Trail. A future trail will tie that to Kane's Crossing which links up with a paved trail that Maronda Homes completed in the Walnut Creek subdivision. It will eventually connect with trails to the north.

## Galena Receives Preservation Parks Grant

Galena also was awarded a \$15,791.25 from Preservation Parks of Delaware County. The funds will allow the Village to replace an old 7' with a new 6' slide, add a tot slide, and add safe surface materials under both in Ruffner Park.

## Trash Bids

The Village of Galena Council members discussed details of trash bids that were opened Nov. 24. Four vendors submitted bids and three of those provided sufficient information for consideration. The lowest bidder was Big-O Refuse at \$44.64/quarter/household with a 5.1% increase each year. The next lowest bidder was Waste Management with Republic Waste Service entering the highest bid. Representatives from Waste Management and Big-O Refuse were in Council to answer questions. Concerns were raised about Waste Management's fuel sur-

charge. Council tabled action on the trash hauling contract until Jan. 5.

## CAD Standards Approved

Council passed a resolution amending the Subdivision Code of 2006. The amendments include construction and development standards for Common Access Drives (CADs).

## Council Actions

Council also passed a resolution adopting an identity theft policy to comply with a new federal law and held second readings on personnel hiring resolutions for 2009.

## Snow Emergency

We've had some harsh winter weather early this year, so it's time to talk about snow emergencies. Last year, residents were great about voluntarily moving their vehicles when there was snow accumulation. This helped Village personnel immensely in being able to clear your streets safely and efficiently.

So, just a reminder, the mayor may declare a snow emergency if:

- more than 2" of snow falls within a 24-hour period; and,
- additional snow is expected; or,
- ice accumulates to the point it impairs safe movement of traffic.

Vehicles would need to be moved from the following streets if a snow emergency is declared: Columbus, Front, Middle, Water, West, Rose, Quinn, Heathermere Drive, Heathermere Loop, Tristaine Court, Zoar, Melimare, Caleb's Court, Nesting Court, and Hawking Drive, as well as the Village's portion of

Joe Walker, Vans Valley, Dustin, and Alexander roads.
